

**ORDINANCE UPDATING AND DIVIDING THE COUNTY OF FLOYD FOUR
COUNTY COUNCIL DISTRICTS**

Whereas, the Floyd County Commissioners that in addition to redistricting county commissioner districts (IC 36-2-2-4) and establishing voting precincts (IC 3-11-1.5-2) the county commissioners are ultimately responsible for establishing county council districts;

Whereas, the Floyd County Commissioners are required to redistrict in 2011 per IC 35-2-3-4(e) following the 2010 census. However, the Floyd Commissioners may also redistrict County Council Districts in an "odd numbered" year per IC 36-2-3-4(f).

Whereas, the Floyd County Commissioners seek to establish County Council districts by adopting an ordinance that describes the districts per IC 36-2-3-4.7.

Whereas, the Floyd County Commissioners in recent years completed redistricting changing the voting precincts for the County;

Whereas, the Floyd County Commissioners have determined that a good faith effort to improve the proportions and lower the deviation among the Floyd County's Four (4) County Council election districts is needed;

Whereas, the Floyd County Commissioners have evaluated the census data and now desire to update County Council election districts;

Now, Therefore, Be it Ordained by the Floyd County Commissioners make the following changes to the Floyd County Council voting districts:

(A) The Floyd County Commissioners ordinance shall update as provided the changes to the Floyd County Council districts as follows:

- (1) The County Council shall continue to be divided into four (4) Districts.
- (2) Pursuant to I.C. 36-2-2-4, the County Commissioners shall divide the County into four (4) districts that:
 - a. Are composed of contiguous territory;
 - b. Are reasonably compact;
 - c. Do not cross precinct boundary lines.
 - d. Contain, as nearly as possible, equal population. The Floyd County Commissioners in determining population, have relied on U.S. Census Data from the 2010 Census located at <http://www.census.gov/2010census/data/>. All population figures contained in this ordinance are from the aforementioned Data Source.
 - e. The Floyd County Commissioners have attempted to redistrict the County Council boundaries in such a way as to keep all townships whole.

Where the Commissions have deviated from townships boundaries, it was done in an effort to appropriate the districts populations as equal as possible.

- (3) The districts are divided as follows:

(B) The Floyd County Commissioners have prepared a map showing the present boundaries of the County Council districts and has attached as Exhibit "C" hereto for reference;


(C) The Floyd County Commissioners has prepared a map showing the new boundaries of the districts and has attached as Exhibit "A" hereto for reference;

(D) A notice shall be provided to the County Clerk upon introduction of this ordinance.





AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING BUSINESS TRAVEL

WHEREAS, the Floyd County Commissioners, with the approval of the County Council, shall establish policies and rates for employee business travel and reimbursement including overnight lodging, per diem and transportation expenses. All such reimbursements are subject to approval with appropriate documentation being submitted to the County Auditor. In all cases, the expense for which an employee seeks reimbursement shall have been budgeted in departmental budgets or else specifically approved by the County Council. Expenses not budgeted or approved by the County Council will not be reimbursed.

NOW THEREFORE:

BE IT ORDAINED, Employee pay for travel time shall be determined according to applicable provisions of the Fair Labor Standards Act.

BE IT ORDAINED, business rental rates, terms, and conditions are adopted annually by the County Commissioners and are hereby adopted by reference.

BE IT ORDAINED, rental cars are not permitted by County policy and will not be reimbursed from County funds. When using air/travel and subsequent cab, shuttle or train to a destination, an employee will be reimbursed with those submitted receipts.


BE IT ORDAINED, a County employee, with the approval of their supervisor, may elect to travel and be reimbursed for lodging the night before the scheduled business meeting/education. However, the destination must be located 75 miles or more from the City-County Building to reimburse for hotel and meal per diem for that night.

BE IT ORDAINED, travel expenses that require staying in a hotel will be paid at the rate of \$125.00 per night or the negotiated rate.

BE IT ORDAINED, meals associated with overnight travel will be reimbursed to the employee at a rate of \$26.00 per day. There is no meal reimbursement or deduction for "daily" (or non-overnight) business travel, per IRS rules and regulations. Employees will also not be reimbursed if meals are provided by the meeting or seminar.
